My work involves thorough assessments, formulation of client challenges, and the delivery of evidence-based interventions for adults and children following brain injuries. I collaborate closely with case managers, multi-disciplinary teams, and external services, such as slow-stream neurorehabilitation facilities like Enable Care, to ensure a cohesive and holistic approach to treatment.

In my role, I take an adaptable and proactive approach—whether leading clinical decision-making, offering training, or providing support to colleagues. I am experienced in working both individually and systemically, offering joint supervision to rehabilitation assistants and engaging with families to optimize care outcomes.

I am highly trained and experienced in a range of therapeutic modalities, including (but not limited to) Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT), Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR), Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), Compassion-Focused Therapy (CFT), and Narrative Exposure Therapy (NET). My clinical experience extends to a broad spectrum of mental health presentations, ensuring personalized and effective treatment plans.
